To promote teamwork, problem-solving, and creative thinking, an Inter-House Math Competition was held on 13th and 16th June 2025.



→ On 13th June, "Solve and Seek" engaged Classes 3 to 5 in fun math activities to build speed, accuracy, and reasoning skills.
