## EDUCATIONAL VISIT TO ISRO, BENGALURU

From 31st July to 2nd August 2025, 35 students of APS Wellington went on an educational trip to Bengaluru. Highlights included visits to the HAL Heritage Museum and ISRO Satellite Centre (URSC). At ISRO, Mr. Murthy P.V.N., Senior Scientist, gave an insightful talk and video presentation on India's space achievements. Students also viewed satellite models, gaining valuable exposure to India's space research.




## POP OPERA – “ANY DREAM WILL DO”
